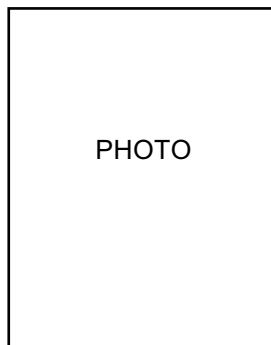

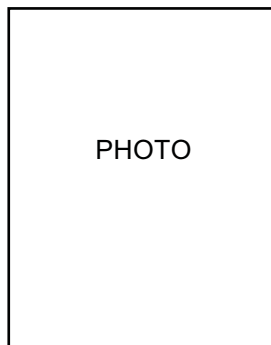

GRADUATE ADMISSION APPLICATION AND INSTRUCTIONS

1. Complete all questions on the application.
2. Attach a non-refundable check or money order payable to **NYIT** for \$50 (U.S.) to the front of the application form. Please write your Social Security number on the check or money order. Your cancelled check is your receipt. Please do not send cash.
3. Submit official transcripts with proof of degree from all undergraduate, graduate, and professional schools attended. You may have them sent directly to the Office of Graduate Admissions or submit the transcripts in the original sealed envelope as part of your application packet. Photocopies or student copies are not considered official; however, you may wish to submit a photocopy along with your application for reference until the official copies are received.
4. If you are an international applicant, the following conditions apply:
 - You must submit recent results of a Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) or International English or Language Testing System (IELTS) examination for applicants whose native language is not English. Scores must be sent directly from the Educational Testing Service (ETS). NYIT's ETS code is **2561**.

If you require a student visa to attend NYIT, please note the following:

- All international applications and supporting credentials are due at least three months prior to your intended start date to assure adequate time to process the required documents.
 - A copy of your passport is required to process your application.
 - An official notarized affidavit of support and bank statement are required from your sponsor.
 - If you are currently in the country and/or studying at a U.S. university, please submit the transfer I-20 form, proof of visa (copy of I-94 form), and a visa waiver form if you entered the country on a visa other than F-1.
5. For additional requirements to your program, please refer to the section **Graduate Application Documents Required**.
 6. Where noted, it is the applicant's responsibility to request that ETS forward official copies of Graduate Management Admissions Test (GMAT) or Graduate Record Examination (GRE) scores directly to the Office of Graduate Admissions.
 7. Immunization Records – Public Health Law 2165 requires college students to present a complete record of two live immunizations against measles and a single immunization against mumps and rubella. Students born on or after Jan. 1, 1957 must submit a completed immunization record signed by a health practitioner. Your registration for classes will not be valid until this information has been provided.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Requirements for admission to graduate study at NYIT vary with the discipline the applicant chooses. All applicants are required to hold a baccalaureate degree or its equivalent from an accredited college or university and must submit the completed application form.

Readmission of Former Students — If you are a former student of NYIT who wishes to return and/or resume study, you must apply for readmission.

If your last date of attendance was within the past five years and you have not taken any college credits, you must complete and submit a rematriculation form through the Office of the Registrar, along with a \$50 processing fee. Completion of this form will waive any and all rights of transfer credit taken since your last date of attendance at NYIT.

If your last date of attendance was more than five years ago or you have taken college credits since your last date of attendance at NYIT, you must submit a new application through the Office of Admissions along with a \$50 processing fee and all necessary supporting documents.

Nonmatriculated (Nondegree) Applicants — Regardless of whether you are enrolled at other institutions, you are welcome to enroll in the spring, summer, or fall semester on a nondegree basis and take up to 9 credits.

You must first file an application for nonmatriculated status, which can be obtained through the Office of Admissions.

ADMISSION OF INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS

International students are, in general, expected to follow the same regulations and procedures as those set forth for all entering students.

In addition:

1. International students must file a notarized affidavit and notarized bank statement(s) with the Office of Graduate Admissions at the Old Westbury campus.
2. International applicants who have earned undergraduate degrees at a foreign university must provide proof of English proficiency. This may be accomplished by achieving a minimum of 550 written, 213 computer-based or 80 Internet-based on the TOEFL or a 6 on the IELTS.

a. The TOEFL score of 550 or better is sufficient for the applicant to obtain an initial acceptance. However, if it becomes apparent to administration or faculty members that the TOEFL score is not truly representative of English ability, either prior to or after beginning at NYIT, the college maintains the right to require the student to pass an examination in English proficiency developed by the college, and/or enroll in one or more English courses as a corequisite to continued graduate study.

Applicants who submit TOEFL scores between 500 and 550 on the written exam, 173 to 213 on the computer-based exam, or 61 to 80 Internet-based exam will be required to take the NYIT English proficiency examination upon arrival as a condition of acceptance into graduate study. Such students may then be required to enroll in an appropriate English course or sequence of courses. The English proficiency requirement will be satisfied by the successful completion of the required course or sequence of courses.

Applicants who submit TOEFL scores under 500 written, 173 computer-based, or 61 Internet-based or IELTS below 5 cannot be admitted into graduate programs at NYIT. International graduate applicants who meet academic requirements and further details may be obtained by writing to: NYIT, Office of Admissions, ELI Program, Northern Boulevard, P.O. Box 8000, Old Westbury, NY 11568-8000.

b. The IELTS score of 6 or better is required for full admission. Applicants who submit IELTS scores between 5 and 6 will be required to take the NYIT English proficiency examination upon arrival as a condition of acceptance into graduate study. Such students may then be required to enroll in an appropriate English course or sequence of courses. The English proficiency requirement will be satisfied by the successful completion of the required course or sequence of courses.

ADMISSION OF INTERNATIONAL GRADUATE APPLICANTS WITHOUT U.S.-EQUIVALENT BACCALAUREATES (BRIDGE PROGRAM)

Applications from international students who have completed only a three-year post-secondary program that is equivalent to three years of undergraduate study in the United States, or a four-year program that is not equivalent to an American baccalaureate degree, will be considered with the following additional provisions:

- The student may be required to take an NYIT English proficiency examination prior to enrollment.
- Each student must complete a minimum of 30 additional undergraduate credits with a grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.00. A substantial number of these credits may be English as a Second Language (ESL) courses depending upon the results of the proficiency examination.

- Upon satisfactory completion of these 30 credits, the student will be granted provisional status in the chosen graduate program and expected to meet all requirements of this status, which includes the achievement of a minimum 3.00 GPA through the first 12 graduate credits.

The Bridge Program credits are charged at the current graduate per credit tuition.

MASTER OF ARCHITECTURE PROGRAM

Applicants for admission to the Master of Architecture in Urban and Regional Design program are required to hold a professional degree from an accredited college or university approved by the National Architectural Accrediting Board, or the equivalent if applying with a foreign degree from another country. A portfolio of architectural design work must be submitted with the application for review and should consist of 8 1/2" X 11" bound photocopies of work that will not be returned.

International applicants to the Master of Architecture program should note that a professional five-year Bachelor of Architecture degree is required for entry into this program. All international credentials must be evaluated by World Education Services (www.wes.org). Applicants who do not hold a Bachelor of Architecture degree and wish to qualify for the graduate degree must first apply for and be accepted into the NYIT Bachelor of Architecture program, which requires completion of the first two years of the undergraduate degree with a GPAs of at least 2.75 (B-), as well as an acceptable portfolio of the first four semesters of design studio.

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 or higher and an acceptable portfolio will be admitted to fully matriculated status. Those with undergraduate GPAs between 2.50 and 2.84 may, at the discretion of the director, be admitted to provisionally matriculated status, with the opportunity to demonstrate their qualifications for full-time matriculation by achieving a graduate GPA of 3.00 or better in their first four graduate degree courses. In addition, these students may be required to take one or more parts of the GRE. The Master of Architecture program is only offered at the Manhattan campus.

MASTER OF ARTS IN COMMUNICATION ARTS

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 or higher will be admitted to fully matriculated status in the master's degree in communication arts. Those with undergraduate GPAs between 2.50 and 2.84 may, at the discretion of the director, be admitted to provisionally matriculated status, with the opportunity to demonstrate their qualifications for full-time matriculation by achieving a graduate GPA of 3.00 or better in their first four graduate degree courses. In addition, these students may be required to take one or more parts of the GRE.

Students applying for the computer graphics program in communication arts must also submit a portfolio to demonstrate proficiency in motion graphics, TV graphics, or 2-D or 3-D graphics.

MASTER OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (M.B.A)

Applicants for admission to the M.B.A. program are required to take the GMAT. Admission to the program is predicated on the achievement of a satisfactory composite score as established by the graduate faculty. The complete score consists of a weighted combination of the applicant's undergraduate GPA and the score received on the GMAT. Applicants may be admitted to a status of accepted or accepted with conditions, depending on the composite score.

All M.B.A. applicants are required to take the GMAT and submit scores before a decision on acceptance can be made.

MASTER OF FINE ARTS IN COMPUTER GRAPHICS AND ANIMATION, GRAPHIC DESIGN, AND FINE ARTS AND TECHNOLOGY

Applicants seeking admission to the Master of Fine Arts (M.F.A.) programs are required to have earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts (B.F.A.) or equivalent degree from an accredited college or university. A portfolio of original art and design work must also be submitted to the Fine Arts Graduate Portfolio Committee for evaluation. All portfolios must be sent on a CD or DVD and formatted to display independently on multiple platforms. The CD/DVD portfolio must include: 1) an inventory of the contents of the portfolio, detailing each work with the title, brief description, measurements or time length and date of completion. Collaborative work must be individually identified and credited as such. 2) Contact information, including name, address, telephone, and e-mail. 3) Twelve examples of current work in total, including two non-digital drawings of the human figure.

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 or higher and an acceptable portfolio will be admitted to fully matriculated status. Those whose GPA falls between 2.60 and 2.84 may, at the discretion of the director, be admitted to provisionally matriculated status, with the opportunity to demonstrate their qualifications for full matriculation by achieving a graduate GPA of 3.0 or better in their first four graduate degree courses. In addition, students may be required to take one or more parts of the (GRE).

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN CLINICAL NUTRITION (online-only) AND MASTER OF SCIENCE IN HUMAN RESOURCES MANAGEMENT AND LABOR RELATIONS PROGRAMS

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 or higher can be accepted directly to the program. Those whose undergraduate GPA falls between 2.50 and 2.84 may, at the discretion of the director, be admitted to the status of accepted with conditions, with the opportunity to demonstrate their qualifications for full-time matriculation by achieving a GPA of 3.0 or better in the first four graduate degree courses. In addition, such students may be required to take one or more parts of the GRE and meet individual departmental requirements. Two letters of recommendation and an interview are required for the Human Resource Management Program. In general, students in this category will not be permitted to continue in the program for more than two semesters unless they have qualified for matriculated status or have special extenuating circumstances.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN ENERGY MANAGEMENT, COMPUTER SCIENCE, ELECTRICAL AND COMPUTER SCIENCE ENGINEERING, INFORMATION NETWORK AND COMPUTER SECURITY, AND ENVIRONMENTAL TECHNOLOGY PROGRAMS

Admission to any of these programs requires a Bachelor of Science degree in computer science, engineering, or closely related field (e.g., physics or mathematics) from an accredited program with a minimum 2.85 GPA.

Applicants to any of these programs who do not have a minimum 2.85 GPA from an accredited program, but appear to have the potential for success, may be required to take the GRE. Admission will be based upon consideration of the test results, previous academic performance, related employment, and an interview.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY PROGRAM

If you are applying for admission into the Master of Science in Occupational Therapy Program, please do not use the attached application form. The department will only accept applications submitted online through the Occupational Therapy Centralized Application Service (OTCAS) at www.otcas.org.

All accompanying materials (including transcripts, letters of recommendation, and proof of 100 hours of volunteer work from a licensed OT) must also be sent directly to OTCAS. OTCAS will verify your application for accuracy, tabulate the information and submit a report to the Masters of Science in Occupational Therapy Program.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN PHYSICIAN ASSISTANT STUDIES PROGRAM

If you are applying for admission into the Master of Science in Physician Assistant Studies program, please do not use the attached application form. The department will only accept applications that are submitted online through the Centralized Application Service for Physician Assistants (CASPA) at www.caspaonline.org.

All accompanying materials (including transcripts and letters of recommendation) must also be sent directly to CASPA. CASPA will verify your application for accuracy, tabulate the information and submit a report to the Department of Physician Assistant Studies.

DOCTOR OF PHYSICAL THERAPY PROGRAM

If you are applying for admission into the Doctor of Physical Therapy Program, please do not use the attached application form. The department will only accept applications that are submitted online through the Physical Therapy Centralized Application Service (PTCAS) at www.ptcas.org.

All accompanying materials (including transcripts, letters of recommendation and proof of 100 volunteer hours) must also be sent directly to PTCAS. PTCAS will verify your application for accuracy, tabulate the information and submit a report to the Doctor of Physical Therapy program.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING

Admission to the Mental Health Counseling Program occurs in two steps. First, applicants must submit a graduate application with the following: 1) a bachelor's degree from institutions of recognized standing with a minimum 3.0 GPA, 2) a personal essay detailing the reasons applying to NYIT's, School of Health Professions. 3) three letters of recommendations from supervisors and faculty 4) a writing sample of published work or the best work in undergraduate program. After the abovementioned conditions have been met, the applicant will be contacted for a personal interview. For further details about the program, see the program description in the catalog.

GRADUATE PROGRAMS IN EDUCATION (SEE GRADUATE CATALOG FOR ADDITIONAL DETAILS)

Applicants for all graduate education programs are expected to have earned an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or better. See graduate catalog for information regarding admission with less than 3.00 GPA.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN ADOLESCENCE EDUCATION, CHILDHOOD EDUCATION, INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY, AND SCHOOL COUNSELING PROGRAM

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 3.00 and above or who have earned a master's degree will be accepted directly into the program. Applicants with an

undergraduate GPA of 2.85 to 2.99 will be granted the status of "accepted with conditions." Those with an undergraduate GPA of 2.50 to 2.84 must take the GRE and earn a minimum score of 1,000 combined on any two sections to be granted the status of "accepted with conditions." Exceptional applicants with an undergraduate GPA below 2.5 who have notable documented achievements may petition the School of Education Admissions Committee for an exception to the above requirements.

ADOLESCENCE EDUCATION: SPECIALIST IN MATHEMATICS—ADVANCED PREPARATION

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 3.00 and above or who have earned a master's degree will be accepted directly into the program. Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 to 2.99 will be granted the status of "accepted with conditions." Those with an undergraduate GPA of 2.50 to 2.84 must take the GRE and earn a minimum score of 1,000 combined on any two sections to be granted the status of "accepted with conditions."

ADOLESCENCE EDUCATION: SPECIALIST IN SCIENCE—ADVANCED PREPARATION

Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 3.00 and above or who have earned a master's degree will be accepted directly into the program. Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 to 2.99 will be granted the status of "accepted with conditions." Those with an undergraduate GPA of 2.50 to 2.84 must take the GRE and earn a minimum score of 1,000 combined on any two sections to be granted the status of "accepted with conditions."

CHILDHOOD EDUCATION—INITIAL PREPARATION

Applicants must have earned a bachelor's degree with a major or equivalent in biology, chemistry, economics, English, history, life science, mathematics, physics, psychology, or interdisciplinary arts and sciences. The degree must include general education study in English, social studies, science, mathematics, a language other than English, and creative expression. Otherwise, qualified applicants will be permitted to enter and make up deficits in general education (limit: two areas). Applicants must also provide evidence that they have passed the LAST. A structured interview and in-person writing sample are also required.

CHILDHOOD EDUCATION—ADVANCED PREPARATION

The Childhood Education program prepares master teachers who use the power of technology to address student needs and an understanding of the use of effective and research-based strategies to teach all students. This program is for applicants with a bachelor's degree and initial certification from the state of New York. Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 3.00 and above or who have earned a master's degree will be accepted directly into the program. Applicants with an undergraduate GPA of 2.85 to 2.99 will be granted the status of "accepted with conditions." Those with an undergraduate GPA of 2.50 to 2.84 must take the GRE and earn a minimum score of 1,000 combined on any two sections to be granted the status of "accepted with conditions." A structured interview, two relevant letters of recommendation, and a writing sample are required.

SCHOOL LEADERSHIP AND TECHNOLOGY

Applicants must have earned a master's degree, be permanently/professionally certified as a teacher in New York State and have at least three years successful teaching experience. An interview, in-person writing sample, technology competency, and two letters of reference from school building administrators endorsing your candidacy are also required. A copy of your New York State teacher certification is required.

INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY—EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY SPECIALIST

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree and initial/provisional or permanent/professional teacher certification in any area. A copy of New York state certification(s) must be submitted with the application.

INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY EDUCATOR—NO CERTIFICATION

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree as well as taken a course in human growth and development or its equivalent. Applicants without this prerequisite may be required to take EDPC 615.

DISTANCE LEARNING

Applicants must have a master's degree or equivalent background in instructional technology or a related field.

COMPUTERS IN EDUCATION

21st-CENTURY TEACHING SKILLS

SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, AND MATHEMATICS (STEM) FOR EDUCATORS

Applicants must have a bachelor's degree and initial/provisional or permanent/professional teacher certification in any area. A copy of New York state certification(s) must be submitted with the application.
